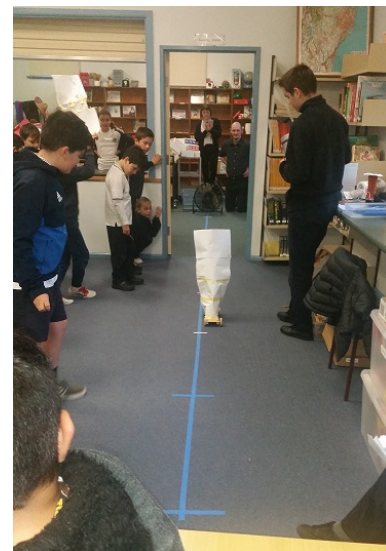
Refugee Week

The Australian Government recognises the importance of all young Australians being able to visit the national capital as part of their Civics and Citizenship education. To assist families in meeting the cost of the excursion the Australian Government contributed funding of \$20 per student under the Parliament and Civics Education Rebate program towards those costs.

Students visited Parliament House, Old Parliament House, Government House, The Australian National Museum, The Royal Mint, The Australian War Memorial, National Arboretum, Dinosaur Museum, Questacon, Australian Institute of Sport and Laser Tag. Not sure how we managed to fit in such a busy schedule but students really valued these learning opportunities. 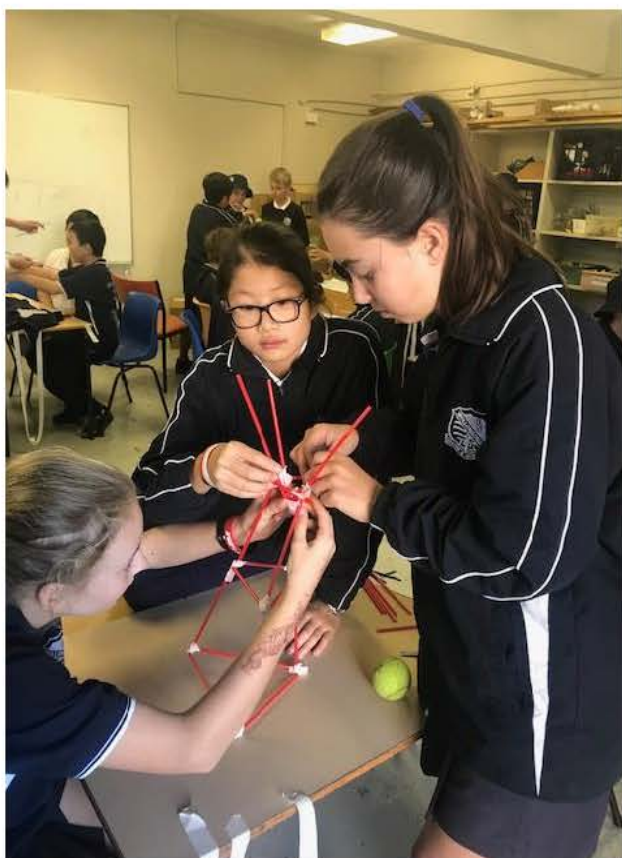
Ms Perry

On the 7th of June, Robyn Perry came to visit 5OC and 6OC. Ms Perry's grandson, Liam is in 5OC this year. Ms Perry was in the **first ever** OC at Wollongong Public School, 53 years ago, in 1965. We believe that they are the first grandmother and grandson combination to have attended the OC at WPS.

Ms Perry spoke about her time in the OC and how Wollongong Public has changed since she attended. When Ms Perry was in 6OC, she was based in the current 5OC classroom. In some ways, the OC was extremely different. For example; when Ms Perry was studying for an assignment, she would spend hours pouring over books because in her time, having any electronic device was rare and too expensive. In some ways though, the OC then was very similar to the OC today; creativity and independent thinking were strongly encouraged and appreciated.

Ms Perry stayed whilst we participated in a STEM session. Our challenge was to build the tallest tower (from straws and masking tape) that could withstand the weight of a tennis ball for a minimum of three (3) seconds.

She also shared how when she was in the year 6OC, her class protested with banners and chants because they didn't want to be separated from their Stage 3 peers, in C Block. Successfully they were given a class with the rest of stage 3.

It was a great day and I loved sharing our current experiences with my grandmother and comparing the OC similarities over time.

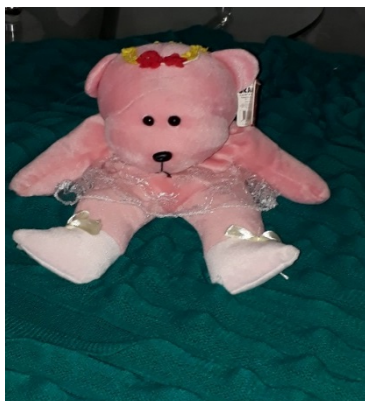

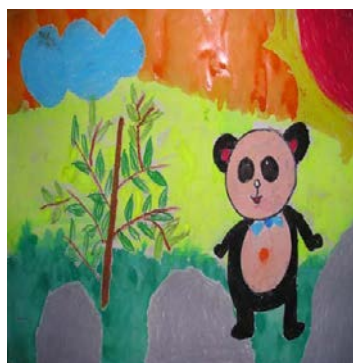
