### Weekly message

### Dear Parents,

We are now half way through Term 4 – how the year has flown! My apologies for last week as I needed to take some unexpected leave, so unfortunately was unable to complete last Friday's newsletter column or attend our Trivia Night. Significant events for this week and next are:

### **Internet Upgrade**

On Monday our school is having a major upgrade to our internet, and we have been advised that **we will have no internet connectivity between 1.00pm and 4.00pm**, so we will be off-line for that period. Given that our phone system is now digital, we are unsure if the phones will be affected, so we are warning you in case this does happen.

### **Building Update**

This week we had a full team meeting between our Department, the consultancy team and the builders to review the layout of every room in our new learning building. We looked at the layout of all fixed joinery, the location of interactive whiteboards, power and data terminals as well as finalising the furniture requests. It was a mammoth meeting as we looked at nearly 30 rooms individually, but was well worth it as we are confident that our new learning spaces will not only look spectacular, but will also operate very effectively. We then had a tour of the site which is now rapidly taking shape, with the roof framework going up and the stairs poured yesterday.

### **P&C** Trivia Night

I understand the Trivia Night was a great success with over \$4000 raised for our school. Thanks to all who participated and a special thank you to Stacey and the team for organising this event. I would also

like to thank the anonymous donor from our school community who gave a donation of \$1000 and also our builders, Hansen and Yuncken for their donation of \$500.

### **Science Award**

At the STANSW Young Scientist Presentation night on Friday, 1st of November at the UOW, Ronin Naumovski, from class 5L, received the "Most Promising Award" in the K-6 category. This award was one of only three presented on the night. Ronin competed against hundreds of students across NSW to earn this award. His science project investigated the properties of static electricity. Congratulations, Ronin!

### Local History Primary School Prize

This year the 'Local History Prize' competition was extended to Primary School students for the first time. Primary schools from all over the Illawarra were invited to submit entries looking at our local history. The presentation was at Wollongong City Library on Wednesday night, and all judges were impressed with the high level of submissions. Roopam, Scott and Evie were awarded with Highly Commended awards, and Archie was announced as one of five winners, earning a \$200 prize for our school. ### **Deputy Principal News**

### **Effective Feedback**

The research is clear: improving feedback practices can significantly improve student learning and the quality of teaching in classrooms. Effective feedback practices provide the bridge between assessment and learning. High quality feedback can improve student learning, providing enhanced growth in student achievement across the year.

Teaching, learning and assessment activities provide opportunities for teachers to gather evidence about students' progress. This informs teacher feedback that is provided to students about their learning and what they need to do next to move forward. The evidence also provides feedback to teachers, allowing them to evaluate and, if necessary, adapt or change strategies to ensure they are meeting the learning needs of their students.

Historically, feedback was mainly issued in written forms in student work books. Over time and through many research projects, our approach to feedback has progressed. We now understand so much more about the benefits and different principles behind feedback, so as a school we have chosen this as a major goal for 2020. Currently at Wollongong Public School, effective feedback takes on many different forms from the list below. You will notice that many forms are verbal as the feedback is immediate, responsive and able to be actioned. Our goal is to identify what has the biggest impact on student learning and focus our attention on this with practices that inform teachers and students, about future directions:

• oral feedback from the teacher, student and their peers, such as collaborative activities and conferencing

- written feedback from the teacher and/or peers, based on the criteria for assessing learning
- whole-class discussions to clarify the task during the activity
- whole-class or individual student comments about aspects of the activity where students performed well, and how to improve
- peer and self-assessments and self-reflections
- checklists, criteria sheets, comments or grades
- ongoing oral or written comments, including questioning students' understanding
- cues, reinforcements or prompts to redirect learning
- drafts and resubmissions
- peer collaborations using online tools
- written, audio or digital annotations
- discussion of a range of student work samples

We have begun making adjustments to our practice already and your child's Semester 2 report will reflect this. More information regarding reports will be provided in the coming weeks. We look forward to this 2020 challenge and will be looking for your input to support all children as they progress on their learning journey.

# Instructional Leader Update by Mrs Neaves and Mrs Critoph

### Data Talks

This week the teachers in Early Stage 1 and Stage 1 have been very busy working with Mrs Neaves and Mrs Critoph to look at student literacy and numeracy data and planning. During this session teachers were able to celebrate the growth of their students by reviewing updated progressions data for writing and numeracy. Teachers were then given the opportunity to revisit their data and select new indicators to focus on during the final weeks of this term. This new and authentic way of looking at class data continues to drive individual teaching practice and also the collaborative planning that is happening with stage teams of teachers.



### Formative and Summative Assessment and the School Excellence Framework

The School Excellence Framework is a document that is used by NSW public schools to assess their practices and to inform planning. During our data talks this week the K-2 staff used the framework to assess where our current practices are for both formative and summative assessment. Through this process it was identified that K-2 staff are 'sustaining and growing' both formative and summative assessment practices and are also 'excelling' in some areas of integrating this into teaching practices. Mrs Neaves and Mrs Critoph would like to congratulate teachers for all of their hard work and for achieving amazing results with assessment practices.
