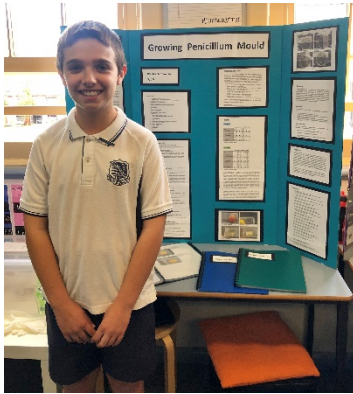
Deputy Principal News

Instructional Leader Update

Data Talks

This week the teachers in Early Stage 1 and Stage 1 have been very busy working with Mrs Neaves and Mrs Critoph to look at student Literacy and Numeracy data and planning. During this session teachers were able to celebrate the growth of their students by reviewing updated progression data for writing and numeracy. Teachers were then given the opportunity to revisit their data and select new indicators to focus on during the first 5 weeks of teaching in Term 4. This new and authentic way of looking at class data continues to drive individual teaching practice and also the collaborative planning that is happening with stage teams of teachers.

Kindergarten Home Reading

Mrs Neaves, Mrs Critoph and Kindergarten teachers are absolutely thrilled at the current success of all Kindergarten children taking home their Familiar Read as part of our home reading program. The children are arriving to school excited about learning to read and taking home their learnt book. Feedback from some of our families has been very positive with parents being able to celebrate their child's reading success at home. Well done to all of our Kindergarten children who are experiencing reading success and returning their home reading book each day.

Please remember that it is essential for the success of this reading program that the book be returned to school the next day as there will be teachers needing this school resource for lessons. **Please regularly check your child's school and reading bag to ensure our reading resources are returned to school each day.**

What is PBL?

PBL stands for Positive Behaviour for Learning. It is a whole school approach for promoting positive behaviour within our school. PBL is about teaching the desired behaviours to students and showing them how they can be successful, allowing for a safe and supportive learning environment.

What are our school values?

Our school values are the expectations the school and community of WPS believe are required to create a positive learning environment. The 3 school values are: **Respect**, **Responsibility** and **Safety**. All areas around the school have the school values and expectations displayed on signs to support students in making positive choices on the playground and in classrooms.



FAST AND FREQUENT PUGGLE



This term, WPS launched the 'fast and frequent' whole school reward system. This system aims to recognise and encourage positive and appropriate behaviours in all areas at school. A fast and frequent puggle is a small token which all K-6 students can receive when they display the three school values on the playground and in the classroom. All K-6 students were set a target of 5000 puggles to achieve a whole school reward, which is decided by the SRC (Student Representative Council).

As all K-6 students reached 5000 puggles this term, we have started a new puggle count. The new current total of puggles that K-6 students have collectively received are:
