Dear Parents,

Today is International Teachers' Day, and I would like to acknowledge not only the work that teachers at our school do, but teachers all over the world. Teachers can have a profound impact on the students in their care, and I'm sure that all of you can remember at least one teacher who made that connection with you as a child, that made a difference in your life and learning. Teaching is a critical profession, and here at Wollongong Public School, we continue to strive to not only improve our teaching practice, but also to enrich the quality of learning, so that every student has the best opportunities in their learning journey.

Activities this week and next include:

Swimming School

Monday saw the start of our Intensive Swimming School, which runs over the next two weeks. 60 of our students travel each day to Corrimal pool where they are taught by qualified instructors how to swim, water safety, and general skills in water survival. This is a very important program, as we have so many beaches and pools close by, and the skills our students learn in these classes can mean the difference between life and death.

Staff Safety Training

While on the subject of saving lives, on Wednesday afternoon all our teaching staff attended a training session for Cardio-Pulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Anaphylaxis management. This is compulsory training for all school staff and ensures that in the event of an emergency, there will always be someone on hand who knows how to respond to an accident or injury, how to administer CPR (this is where chest compressions are used alternatively with mouth to mouth breathing) to give a patient the best possible chance of survival while waiting for an ambulance to arrive. Our training was undertaken by Wollongong First Aid, and we all appreciated how thorough they were in their instruction so that your children have the best care that we can provide.

Kindergarten Orientation

On Tuesday our 2019 Kindergarten students had their first opportunity to visit the Kindergarten classrooms that they will enjoy next year. Parents were able to sit with their children and chat to teachers about their hopes and fears for their first year of formal schooling.

Next week the students will have their first taste of being in a classroom with their new friends while their parents go to the hall to learn more about our school's operation and what to expect from an adult's point of view.

Building Program

Work has continued this week on the refurbishment of the Bottom Grass toilet block, and electrical wiring and plumbing lines are currently being fitted. I am expecting the new demountable toilets to be in use next week.

Movie Night

Tonight is the P&C Movie Night and with Halloween approaching next week, the movie on show will be Monster House (PG), one that the whole family can enjoy! Tickets at the door (\$10 per child with give-aways! adults and pre-schoolers free). The BBQ starts at 5.30 and the movie at 6.00.

Year 7 entry to a Selective High School in 2020 (Current Year 5 students)

Selective high schools cater for high achieving academically gifted students who may otherwise be without sufficient classmates at their own academic and social level. These schools help gifted and talented students to learn by grouping them with other gifted and talented students, teaching them in specialised ways and providing educational materials at the appropriate level.

Applications for selective high school placement are considered mainly on the basis of the Selective High School Placement Test results and school assessment scores. The Selective High School Placement Test will be held on Thursday 14 March 2019.

If you would like to have your child considered for Year 7 selective high school entry in 2020, you need to apply on the internet using a valid email address (not the student's email address). You must submit only ONE application for each student. Detailed instructions on how to apply online are available now at https://education.nsw.gov.au/public-schools/selective-high-schools-and-opportunity-classes/year-. The application website opens at that link on 9 October 2018 and closes on 12 November 2018. You must apply before the closing date. There are no paper application forms. If you do not have internet access, you could apply at a public library. If you have a disability that prevents you from using a computer, you can contact the Unit for assistance after 9 October 2018.
