Dear Parents, Carers, students and community,

Impact of effective Feedback

Our school prides itself on celebrating students learning and success. Each day teacher's provide feedback to children as part of their learning and this helps to encourage and support their development. Feedback enables students to recognise their strengths as well as areas for development, and to identify and plan with their teacher the next steps in their learning. Students are provided with opportunities to improve their knowledge, understanding and skills through feedback that:

- is timely, specific and related to the learning and assessment intention;
- is constructive and provides meaningful information to students about their learning in a variety of forms;
- focuses on the activity and corrects misunderstandings;
- identifies and reinforces students' strengths;
- provides information about how they can improve;
- facilitates the development of and provides opportunities for self-assessment and reflection during the learning process; and
- informs future teaching and learning opportunities.

I encourage you to discuss the feedback your child receives about their learning as effective feedback is such an important aspect of everyday.

OC Orientation

On Thursday this week, I had the privileged position to welcome the 2019 Year 5 Opportunity Class students and their families to our school. Following an introduction, overview and tour of our school, parents departed and children were involved in activities to help them prepare for life at Wollongong PS. I'd like to acknowledge and thank all the work that Ms Stephenson and her team did in preparation for this day. Although the students started a little anxious, I know they left feeling comfortable and excited about joining us next year.

Stage 3 Interrelate Program

This week was the last week of the Interrelate growth and development sessions for Year 5 and 6 students. It was really pleasing to see the high level involvement of students over the past 6 weeks. This program is something we consider invaluable and the learning that takes place is an integral part of the curriculum at this stage of their lives.

Kindergarten enrolments for 2019 (repeat item)

There are currently still some vacancies available for our Kindergarten intake for 2019. If you have not already enrolled your child I would encourage you to do so at your earliest convenience. Please drop in to our school office to pick up your enrolment forms and also make contact with the school if you need support with the enrolment process.

Classes for 2019 (repeat item)

Planning has begun for 2019 classes and there are strict guidelines for class numbers that must be followed. It is imperative that any families who may be leaving us notify the office as soon as possible. It would also be beneficial to inform the school of any new families who may be moving to the area also. Your support in this process will make forming classes consistent for the beginning of the 2019 school year. I would also like to communicate the process for you to express any concerns you may have for your child's class next year. The best method is: 1. Speak with the current teacher about any concerns you may have for 2019 classes. The teacher will be instrumental in organising classes for 2019, so this is the first point of contact regarding: social, emotional and academic concerns.

Building update

The fit-out of the existing toilet block continues to take place this week and access to the southern side of the hall has been restricted until possible Wednesday next week. The builders are pouring a concrete slab in front of the toilet block and have needed to move their fence out to enable them to do this. The concrete pouring should take place on Monday morning and then they will restore access as normal.

Line marking

This week we had an opportunity to repaint our handball courts and create a new lining up area for children by the gate. Handball games may now increase in popularity as these courts were well overdue for repainting. The lining up area was part of the Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL) targets to help make collecting your children a more efficient process.

Trivia Night

Last week's trivia night was a huge success and lots of fun was had by everyone in attendance. We must thank all the P&C volunteers who contributed to the organisation of this event particularly as \$4500 was raised! These funds will be spent updating reading resources throughout the school to help improve access to quality literature for our children.
