STAGE 3 SURF EDUCATION

On Tuesday and Wednesday Stage 3 students were given the opportunity to attend a surf education session with qualified instructors at North Wollongong beach. Student ability and confidence ranged from seasoned veterans to first time beach goers and despite the unfavourable weather conditions on Tuesday, over 140 students willingly and enthusiastically engaged in a variety of surf activities across the 2 days.

The Surf Education Australia instructors had students involved in body surfing and bodyboarding. Students were also shown how to remain safe and calm in a rip current under the watchful eyes of their instructors. In



addition, students were given a presentation on surf safety which informed them of the way waves are formed and how to recognise and handle dangerous surf conditions.

"I enjoyed the activities in the water because it helped boost my confidence in the ocean. When the surf instructors said that we were going to be in a rip, many people were starting to get second thoughts but they passed it quickly enough. Overall, the day was a great experience for us all" - Nina Zhang, 5 OC

At the day's conclusion, the students had evidently gained an extraordinary amount of knowledge and confidence thanks to the amazing work of the staff at Surf Education Australia. The amount of respect and responsibility demonstrated by all WPS students resulted in the event running smoothly and contributed to the day's overall success.

A case of whooping cough has been confirmed in a child from Wollongong Public School

Please take this letter to your doctor if you or your child are coughing

Dear Parent or Guardian

6/12/2018

It is important to look out for these symptoms in you and your child over the next 3 weeks:

- Dry cough
- Cough often worse at night and comes in bouts Runny nose

Note: the "whoop" sound is often not heard in older children and adults

What should I do if my child is coughing?

If you or your child starts coughing please go to your doctor to be tested for whooping cough. **This is extremely important if there is a baby less than 6 month of age living in your household**. Anyone who is being tested for whooping cough should remain at home until the results are available.

- Sore throat

Whooping cough can be a very serious illness for small children, especially babies under twelve months old.

How is it tested?

Whooping cough is tested by a throat or nose swab.

How is it treated?

Whooping cough is a respiratory illness which is treated with a course of antibiotics. To prevent the spread to others, anyone with whooping cough should remain at home until they have had the first five days of antibiotics.

How is it prevented?

Vaccination is the best prevention for whooping cough. However, the **vaccination for whooping cough is not 100% effective and you can still get whooping cough even if you are vaccinated**. NSW Health recommends an adult booster vaccine every 10 years to protect from Diphtheria, Tetanus and Whooping Cough (Pertussis).

CREATIVE KIDS PROGRAM A STEP CLOSER

Families across NSW will soon be able to access the new **\$100 Creative Kids voucher** unlocking the creative abilities of a new generation across the State from 1 January 2019 when the program takes effect.

All relevant providers have been asked to register with Service NSW so they can participate in the program.

Parents will be able to use **one voucher for every school-age child per year** to help meet the cost of structured creative and cultural activities, such as **music lessons**, **languages**, **coding**, **drama and theatre, photography and graphic design**.

So far more than \$200 million has been returned to households this calendar year through various cost of living incentives. Creative Kids will provide parents with even more hip pocket relief.

There are thousands of organisations out there who could be eligible for the program. I am calling on them to register with Service NSW so that parents can claim their \$100 vouchers with them in the New Year.

This is a fantastic initiative that is only made possible because of the strong economic position of the NSW Government.

We can afford to deliver real savings that help the working families of NSW and reduce barriers to healthy activity.

This program compliments the hugely popular Active Kids voucher and for a family with two children, Creative and Active Kids combined will save them \$400 a year.

Creative Kids is one of a raft of NSW Government initiatives helping to ease cost of living pressure for households. Others include cheaper Green Slips and refunds, free car registration for regular toll users and the FuelCheck app.
